Murder.

On the 31st ult., at a place called the "Sinkings," about five miles from Albany, on the King road, the trunk of a human body was found newly buried, the earth apparently recently disturbed, and covered with heavy logs of timber. On digging up the remains, the head, legs, and left hand were missing, and further search has failed to discover them. The remains are believed to be those of John King, exp., late 7756, otherwise known as Jock King, who is missing from Albany, and was last seen near the "Sinkings," on the 2nd ult., in company with a man named John Collins, to whom suspicion attaches as being the murderer. At an inquest held at Albany, on the 6th inst., before Rowley C. Loftie, R.M. and Coroner, on the above remains, the following decision and verdict was given: "From the evidence produced we believe the remains to be those of a man known as Jock King, and that he came by his death by violence, and return a verdict of wilful murder." A warrant has been issued for the arrest of John Collins.

Immediate inquiry is to be made by the Police throughout the Colony, and the utmost endeavor made to ascertain if John King, exp., late 7756, otherwise Jock King, is still alive. Description as under:—Stout, age 54 years, 5ft. 1½ in. high, dark brown hair, light blue eyes, oval visage, fair complexion, cut on forehead, star, crescent, and flower left arm, * left hand. Murder.

On the 31st ult., at a place called the "Sinkings," about five miles from Albany, on the King road, the trunk of a human body was found newly buried, the earth apparently recently disturbed, and covered with heavy logs of timber. On digging up the remains, the head, legs, and left hand were missing, and further search has failed to discover them. The remains are believed to be those of John King, exp., late 7756, otherwise known as Jock King, who is missing from Albany, and was last seen near the "Sinkings," on the 2nd ult., in company with a man named John Collins, to whom suspicion attaches as being the murderer. At an inquest held at Albany, on the 6th inst., before Rowley C. Loftie, R.M. and Coroner, on the above remains, the following decision and verdict was given: "From the evidence produced we believe the remains to be those of a man known as Jock King, and that he came by his death by violence, and return a verdict of wilful murder." A warrant has been issued for the arrest of John Collins.

The missing head, legs, and boots of murdered man were found by Albany Police, on the 11th inst., buried about 100 yards from the spot where the trunk was found. The head and boots have been identified as belonging to John King, exp., late 7756, alias Jock King.

Special Inquiry.

Information is requested respecting the present whereabouts of James Bowtell, exp., late 7011, who left the residence of his employer, John Wort, situate six miles from Kojonup, and has not since been heard of. Kojonup Police report having carefully searched the surrounding locality without having obtained any trace of him, and are of opinion he has either cleared out of the district or fallen into a river, about 1½ miles from Wort's house. Murder.

On the 31st ult., at a place called the "Sinkings," about five miles from Albany, on the King road, the trunk of a human body was found newly buried, the earth apparently recently disturbed, and covered with heavy logs of timber. On digging up the remains, the head, legs, and left hand were missing, and further search has failed to discover them. The remains are believed to be those of John King, exp., late 7756, otherwise known as Jock King, who is missing from Albany, and was last seen near the "Sinkings," on the 2nd ult., in company with a man named John Collins, to whom suspicion attaches as being the murderer. At an inquest held at Albany, on the 6th inst., before Rowley C. Loftie, R.M. and Coroner, on the above remains, the following decision and verdict was given: "From the evidence produced we believe the remains to be those of a man known as Jock King, and that he came by his death by violence, and return a verdict of wilful murder." A warrant has been issued for the arrest of John Collins.

The missing head, legs, and boots of murdered man were found by Albany Police, on the 11th inst., buried about 100 yards from the spot where the trunk was found. The head and boots have been identified as belonging to John King, exp., late 7756, alias Jock King, for whom further inquiry need not be made. John Collins, exp., late 6540, was arrested by Albany Police, on the 7th inst., for this murder.

Special Inquiry.

Information is requested respecting the present whereabouts of James Bowtell, exp., late 7011, who left the residence of his employer, John Wort, situate six miles from Kojonup, and has not since been heard of. Kojonup Police report having carefully searched the surrounding locality without having obtained any trace of him, and are of opinion he has either cleared out of the district or fallen into a river, about 1½ miles from Wort's house. James Bowtell's description is as follows:—stout, age 43 years, 5ft. 6in. high, dark brown hair, blue eyes, long visage, slightly pockpitted, sallow complexion, very lame in right leg; when last seen he was dressed in dirty mole trousers, blue and white cotton shirt, dark tweed vest, very dirty, light billycock hat, also very dirty. He is commonly known as old Tom Brotel. Information to Detective Office, Perth.
