### MAN MISSING, SUPPOSED TO HAVE BEEN MURDERED.

Whereas, on Sunday, the 28th day of January, 1883, a man named Joseph Hillery disappeared from his farm at Chetwynd, and has not since been traced; And whereas there is reason to fear that the said Joseph Hillery has been murdered: Notice is hereby given that a reward of fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for information leading to the discovery of the said Joseph Hillery if alive, and, if murdered, an additional sum of one hundred and fifty pounds for such information as will lead to the conviction of the murderer or murderers.
