Inquiry is made at the instance of his daughter, Mrs. Caroline Kaine, who writes from Malta.

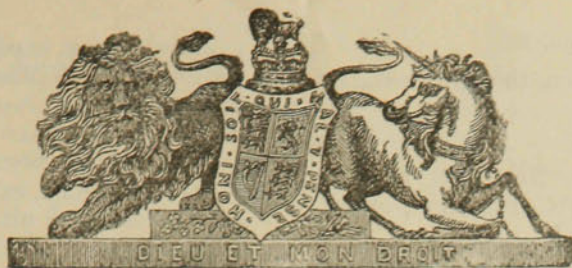
