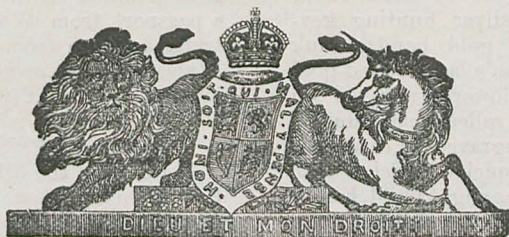

Occurrence Sheets and Shipping Reports (with the exception of those from the Roebourne and Kimberley Districts) will no longer be forwarded to the Detective Office but will be filed at each district office. This will obviate the necessity of making copies of the Occurrence Books of headquarter stations.

Regulation 329, regarding special reports, must be carefully complied with.

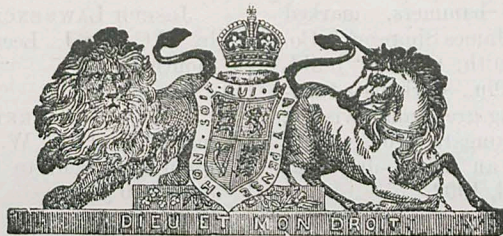

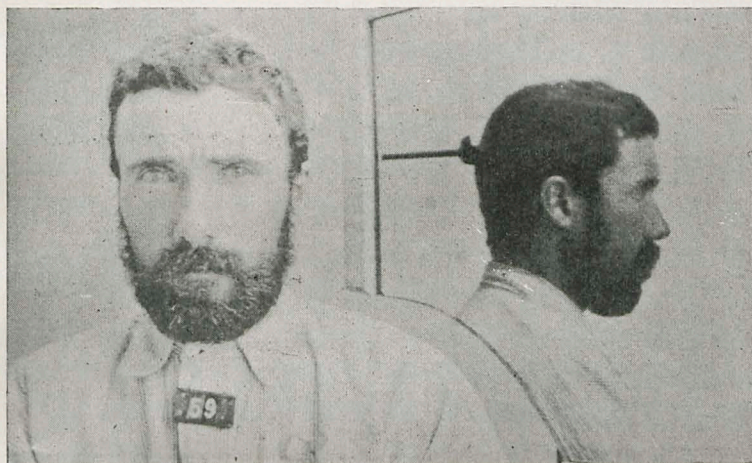
