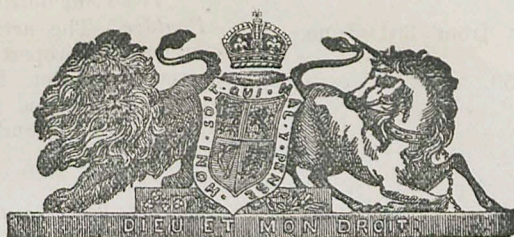

Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

The Immigration Restriction Act, 1901.

C.O. No. $\frac{25}{1602}$.—In all cases of the arrest of coloured aliens who have deserted from ships or who are taken into custody for other reasons, the police in future must furnish information on the matter to the nearest Customs officer in order that it might be determined whether it would be advisable to apply the education test, under section 5, subsection 2, of the Act.

Any subsequent action the Federal authorities may take need not necessarily interfere with the ordinary course of justice. It should rather be regarded as supplementary thereto, as it might, by virtue of the provisions of section 7, lead to steps being taken which would result in the deportation of the offenders from the Commonwealth.
