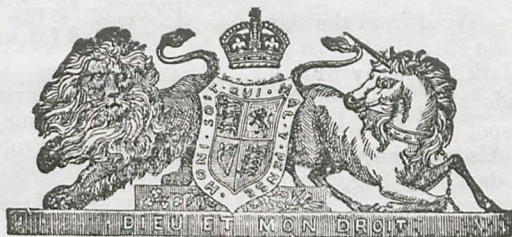

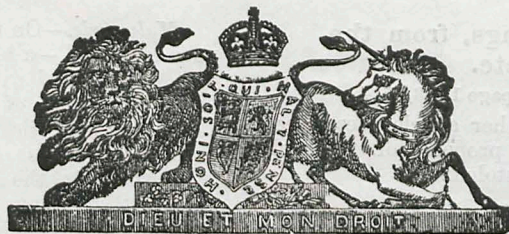

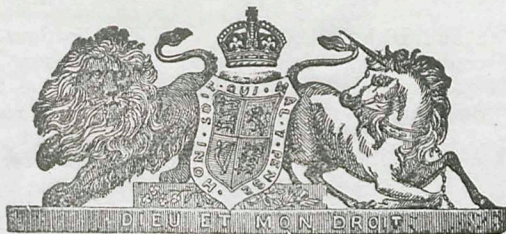

C.O. 2/1904.—The Government Analyst calls attention to the faulty manner in which samples of liquor sent to him for analysis are sealed. He states that in large proportion of cases the corks can be removed without disturbing the wax, and that an impression is seldom used on the seal. Care must be taken in future, therefore, that the bottles are well corked and waxed right over the curve of the neck, and that an impression is made on the seal.
