THE REGISTRATION OF FIRMS ACT.

(61 Vict., No. 14.)

NOTICE.

The attention of firms, or of persons using a firm name, carrying on business within the State, is directed to the penalties imposed by the following section of the above Act:—

Section 11.—“Any person who shall fail to comply with any of the provisions of this Act shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for the first offence, and for every subsequent conviction to a penalty not exceeding One hundred pounds.”

Upon default becoming known, prosecutions will, in pursuance of this section, be at once instituted without formal notice.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council made the 15th day of January, 1902, under the provisions of an Ordinance made and passed in the 24th year of Her late Majesty, intituled "An Ordinance to amend the Ordinance 19th Victoria, No. 8, of 1856, to substitute in certain cases other punishment in lieu of transportation," certain regulations for Ticket-of-Leave Holders were made and provided: AND WHEREAS it is desirable to rescind and amend

certain of the said regulations: NOW, THEREFORE, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, does hereby rescind and vary the said regulations made under the recited Ordinance by the said Order in Council of the 15th day of January, 1902, to the extent and in the manner described in the schedule hereto.

Regulations 3 to 11 inclusive, 13 to 16 inclusive, and 24 are rescinded.

Regulation 22, paragraph (a), is amended by omitting the words "with hard labour in or out of irons not exceeding 12 calendar months or not exceeding 100 lashes," and inserting "for two years or a fine of £200."

Regulation 23, paragraph (4), is amended by adding the words "and may be detained in prison until he has served the full term of his unexpired sentence or sentences."
