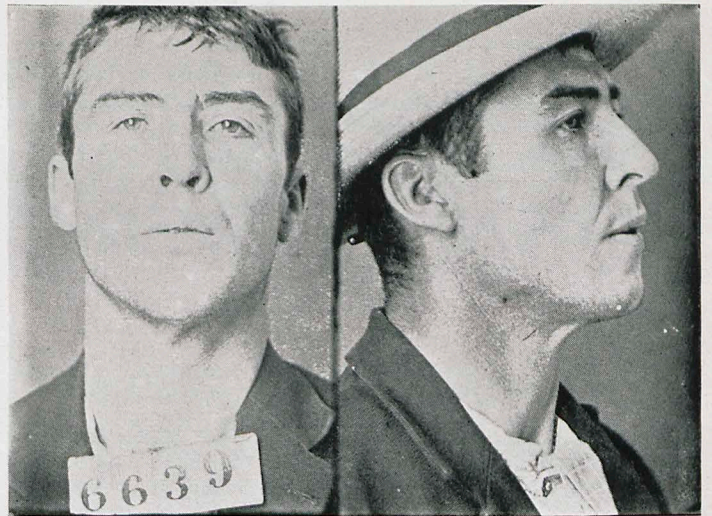

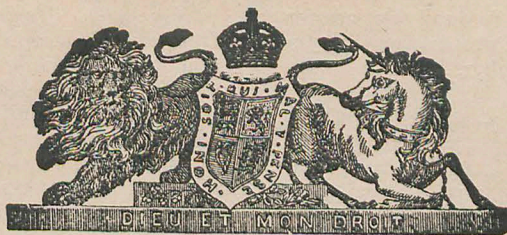

Where provisions are issued in excess of the approved scale, or stimulants allowed by order of a medical officer, the circumstances must be reported, and a special claim rendered.

Separate claims for sentenced and unsentenced prisoners must be rendered as heretofore. Accounts for rations issued to the former must be sent direct to the Prisons Department, accompanied by the usual vouchers.

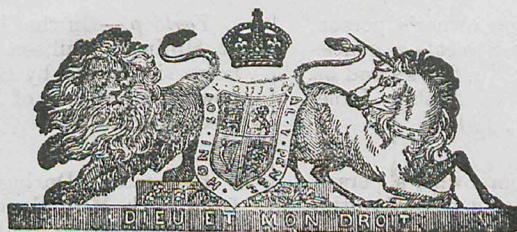
