Robbery under Arms.

TWO HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

WHEREAS about 3.30 a.m., on the 31st August, 1906, four men, armed with revolvers, bound and gagged three workmen on the Hannans Reward Gold Mine, at Kalgoorlie, and stole a quantity of gold slimes, zinc shavings, and tailings, valued at about £300, the property of Messrs. 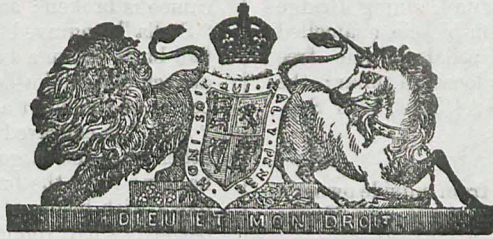

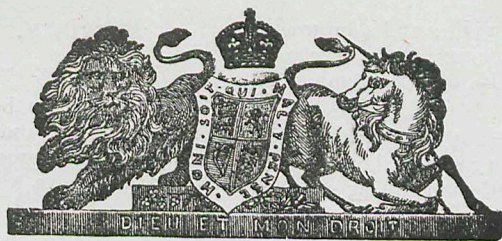
