Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

Police Accounts.

C.O.—^{6/224}—As the practice of including articles or services chargeable to the Police Department, and coming under different heads of service, in the same requisition and account, leads to complications and is opposed to the system of keeping Public Accounts, Officers in charge of Districts and Stations will, for the future, be careful to give separate requisitions and render separate accounts for articles or services coming under the undermentioned heads of service:—

ARMS.—Includes arms and ammunition, revolver cases and repairs.

CLOTHING.—Includes Police uniform, clothing, and clothing allowances.

REMOUNTS.—Horses only.

TRAVELLING EXPENSES AND TRANSPORT.—Includes travelling allowances, passages of Police and their families, transport of Police effects, Police stores, and, when allowed, rations for Police, railway, coach and tram fares, and hire of horses and vehicles.

It does not include passages of prisoners, paupers, or lunatics, for which separate requisitions, giving name and condition, should be given, and separate accounts rendered.

SHOEING AND SADDLERY.—Includes shoeing, horse shoes and nails, shoeing tools, saddlery and harness, repairs to saddlery and harness, horse-rugs, saddle cloths, hobbles, head-stalls, valise straps, mane and curry combs, horse brushes, dander brushes, soft soap, sweet oil, harness paste, etc.

FORAGE.—Includes forage, transport of forage, and paddocking police horses.

FUEL AND LIGHT.—Includes firewood, oil, gas, lamps, lamp glasses, and wick.

INCIDENTAL.—Includes rope, buckets, stable forks, shovels, wheelbarrows, stable brooms, axes, lock-up requisites, hair brooms, hard soap, horse bedding, mats, sails, anchors, chain and boat furniture, paints, paint oil, varnish and paint brushes, canvas

buckets and water bottles, freshwater, when allowed, tools, repairs to boats, carts, and carriages, lime, hire of labor and assistance, and any article or service not included in the foregoing heads of service.

The head of service must be shown on the requisition, and storekeepers, contractors, and others requested to render their accounts in accordance with such requisition, and not include a number of services, coming under different heads, in the same account, as in that case the account has to be classified, divided, and fresh accounts made out in the chief office, and the amount paid at the Treasury in accordance with such classification and division. This, without taking into account the amount of trouble it gives, is a proceeding that is apt to make the banking accounts of the parties concerned less intelligible than they would be were the amount paid as rendered on the original account.

The articles or services covered by any number of requisitions may be included in the same account, provided they come under the same head of service.

Should a doubt exist as to what head a particular service comes under, a separate requisition should be given and a separate account rendered.

Telegraphic Messages.

C.O. ^{6/225}—The Commissioner of Police observes that, notwithstanding the instructions issued to the Police from time to time on the subject, many Officers are in the habit of sending lengthy and unnecessary telegraphic messages.

In many cases the number of words might be reduced by half, without impairing the sense of the telegram.

The instructions issued in Circular Orders ^{6/201} and ^{6/618}, re-published herewith, are to be strictly carried out.

C.O. ^{9/200}.—The Superintendent observes that a practice prevails in the Force of sending lengthy and numerous messages by telegraph, many of which are not urgent and could as easily be communicated by post.

This practice is to be discontinued, and it is to be distinctly understood that messages are not to be sent by telegraph except for the purpose of detecting crime, arresting criminals, conveying an important communication to the Chief Office, or where there is a great saving in time effected and the despatch of a mounted constable avoided; and even in such cases the subject should be embodied in as few words as possible. The sending messages by telegraph should also be confined as much as possible to the senior Officer at each Station.

This is a matter that must in a great measure be left to the discretion of the officers in charge of Divisions, and the Superintendent trusts that they will exercise their discretion wisely.

Perth, 2nd February, 1882.

SIR,—In directing your attention to Gazette Notice No. 788 C.S.O., of 17th January, 1881, regarding the rules to be observed by Government Officials in the transmission of Telegraph Messages on Public Business, I am instructed by His Excellency the Governor to inform you that Telegraph Messages on Public Service must be strictly confined to matters of emergency and that in all other cases a written communication will serve the purpose.

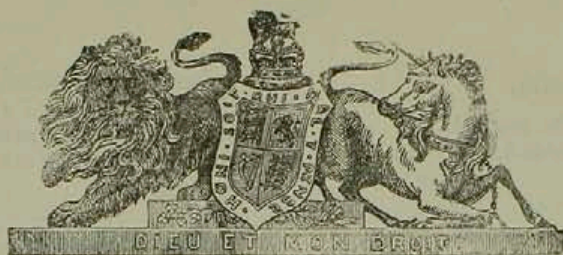
