A warrant has been issued at Palmerston, Northern Territory, for the arrest of JOHN DRYSDALE *alias* MONAGHAN; slight, wiry build, erect and active, age about 38 years, looks less, black hair, whiskers, and moustache, beard rather scanty, small turned up nose, large clear eyes (supposed blue), plausible address, pleasant voice, quiet manner, very steady habits, does not drink or smoke, a good horseman and stockman, for horse-stealing from W. H. Osmond, at Elsie Station, near Catherine, N.T., and wilful murder of ab. nat. Mungo.

This offender was arrested at Eva Downs on 26th October last for horse-stealing, and escaped on the 2nd November, near Anthony lagoon N.T., while in custody, *en route* for Palmerston, having overpowered and bound the constable, and shot dead an ab. nat. witness named Mungo.

After effecting his escape, he took with him 3 police horses, description as follows:—yellow bay gelding, 5  $\frac{1}{2}$  Y on near shoulder, <sup>(Broad Arrow)</sup> off shoulder, 221 near neck, bright bay gelding, 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  V near shoulder, <sup>(Broad Arrow)</sup> off shoulder, 300 near neck, chestnut gelding, W22 near rump, <sup>(Broad Arrow)</sup> near shoulder, white stockings hind feet, blaze face; also 4 horses belonging to the prisoner:—bay gelding, 71 near shoulder, chestnut gelding, silver mane and tail, 6 years old, 3 X near shoulder, bay mare 5 AC under blotch brand near shoulder, H1 near neck, chestnut roan gelding, 92D near thigh, 11 off shoulder, name "Lastland."

Offender also took a Martini Henry Government carbine, belonging to the constable, and was accompanied by a Burketown gin named Lilly, but as she was a witness against him, he will probably murder her.

Police and trackers followed offender's tracks towards Burketown, but owing to scarcity of water, they had to abandon the pursuit. Monaghan has been to the Kimberley Goldfield, and it has been rumoured at Palmerston that he, in conjunction with reputed horse-stealers named Billy Mills, Charley Meehan, and others, stole a number of draught horses, belonging to some New Zealanders from there, and was pursued by W. A. police.

It is believed that he will make for W. A., as he is too well-known to Queensland police, especially in the Gulf District, and has been in gaol at Townsville.

The arrest of this offender is deemed of much importance. Should he be arrested in W. A., a constable of N.T. police will be at once sent for him.

*Escaped French Convict.*

On the 10th January, JEAN HENRY CHARLES ROUSSELOT is supposed to have escaped from the Penitentiary, New Caledonia, where he was undergoing a life sentence for assassination. He is said to be a dangerous criminal, and has escaped on six previous occasions from New Caledonia. It is believed he is making for Australia, and the Police in coast districts are to keep a sharp look-out for him. Description: 34 years of age, 6ft. high, reddish brown eyes, sharp-pointed chin, long features, brown hair, fresh complexion, scar on right foot, right hand, left forearm, and over right eye, coffee colored birthmark on right side of body; has been a commercial traveller.

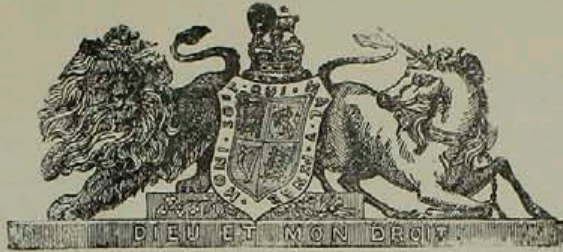

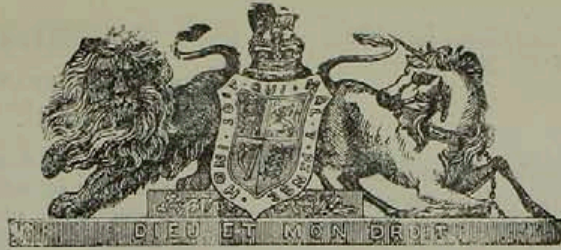

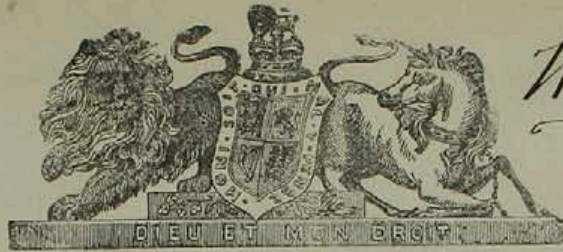
