A reward of £25 is offered by the Government of Tasmania for the arrest of each of the convicts described below, who escaped from the Hobart Gaol on the 3rd April last:—

CHARLES FORD, native of Tasmania, born in 1868, height 5ft. 5½in., fair complexion, dark brown hair, dark moustache, hazel eyes, brown eyebrows, medium nose, wide mouth, broad dimpled chin, weight about 154 lbs., a laborer, Roman Catholic religion, unmarried, tattoo marks, flower on left wrist, W.B. on back of left hand between finger and thumb, part of an anchor and 2 blue dots on left arm, coat-of-arms on right arm, letter T. on right arm, C.F. and woman on wheel on right leg, has 2 moles on left cheek.

ARTHUR WARD, native of Tasmania, born in 1873, height 5ft. 2in., fresh complexion, light brown hair, no beard or moustache, blue eyes, light eyebrows, medium nose, mouth, and chin, weight about 125 lbs., a carpenter, Protestant religion, unmarried.

On the 28th ult. the dead body of a man was found floating in Lake Gueelup, Wanneroo Road, about 7 miles from Perth. The body was much decomposed, and could not be identified. It has been ascertained that a young man named Martin Sutherland has been missing from the vicinity of Subiaco Orphanage for the past 2 months, and that on or about the 7th ult. a young man answering Sutherland's description was seen by a man named John Watson in the vicinity of Lake Gueelup. He was poorly clad, and appeared to be in an unsound state of mind; Watson gave him some food, and he went in the direction of the lake. Sutherland is described as 22 years of age, medium build, about 5ft. 6in. high, fair hair, blue eyes, fair complexion, several front teeth missing from upper jaw, a laborer; he has been in custody at Perth, charged with lunacy. Officers in charge of Districts and Sub-Districts will cause every inquiry to be made for Sutherland, and should any information be received concerning his whereabouts it is to be transmitted by wire to the Detective Office, Perth.
