Information is requested of HENRY LOUIS JULES SPEEHT, a music teacher, native of France, but speaks good English, who left Adelaide in April 1891, for Sydney, where he is reported to have been employed at Collins' Music Hall, as pianist, and was subsequently heard of at Goulburn, New South Wales, under the name of Wilson, age about 34 years, height 5ft. 4in., dark complexion, dark brown hair and probably a moustache, light brown eyes, medium and thin nose, has three scars on left side of neck and a mole over left eyebrow, respectable appearance and will probably seek employment as a tutor, music teacher, or may be heard of playing at Music Halls, or such other places, either in Victoria, or one of the other colonies. Special inquiries are requested, he having left his wife and two children in Adelaide.—C. 1354.

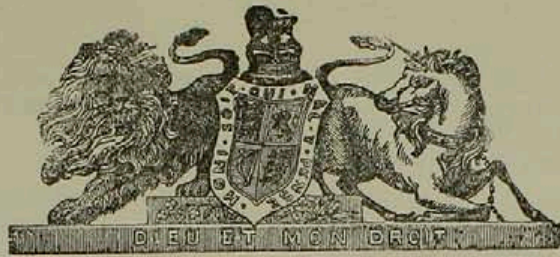

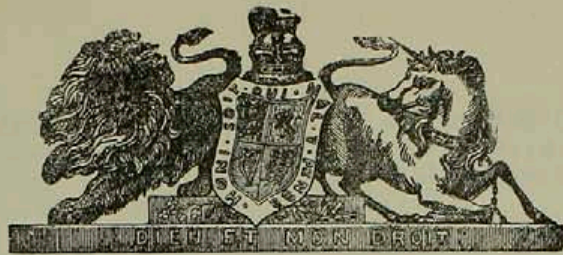
