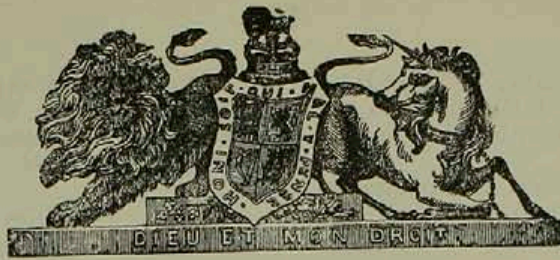

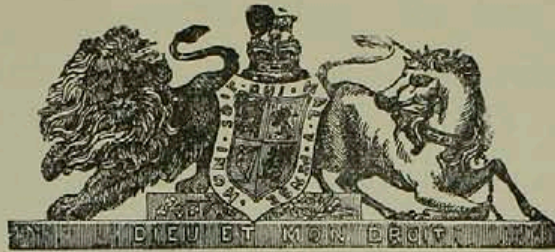

On the 15th October, 1893, the body of a man (name unknown) was found in the river Murray, about 3 miles from Morgan, the head being gashed and throat cut, and had apparently been in the water 10 days or more, and, as the river was flowing strongly, had probably drifted a long distance.

Description:—Age 40 years (perhaps less), height about 5 ft. 6 in., medium build, good teeth (one deficient in lower jaw), hair, most of which had disappeared, apparently light brown. The sleeve of a white shirt was tied around the neck.
