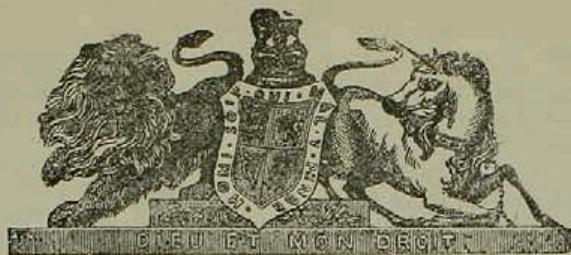

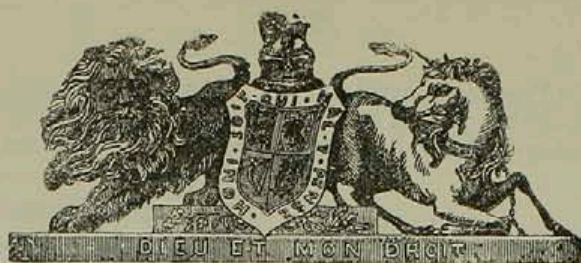

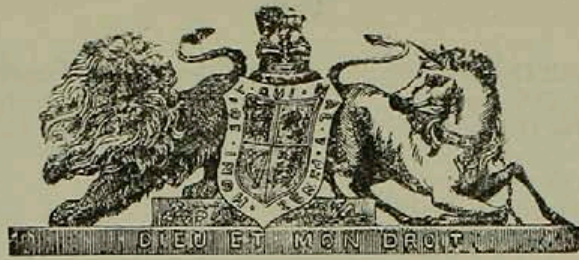

Special Inquiry.

On the 19th inst. the naked body of a man was found in the sea, near the South Mole, at Fremantle. The body had three turns of a nine-thread Manilla rope around it above the naval. The rope had a loop spliced at one end, and was fastened with a "timber hitch," and is supposed to have been used as a belt. There was also a portion of a red and blue striped cotton shirt around the throat. Near the body was found a white flannel undershirt and an old black diagonal sac coat, single breasted, three patch pockets machined to outside, seams and edge of coat machined over outside, no lining, the inside of seams being taped over to prevent fraying when being washed, two loose pieces of cloth under fronts to stiffen up and take buttons and button-holes, four button-holes, three buttons $\frac{3}{4}$ in. diameter, with small rim round edges and four holes for thread, two of the buttons are plain brown composition, the centre one being of similar colour and shape, but mottled with a darker colour; the left-hand pocket has a small hole frayed outside near centre; left sleeve has two small holes frayed on under side, one near cuff and one near shoulder; right sleeve has long hole, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in., frayed out near cuff, and small one near shoulder on under side, and both cuffs are frayed at edge. The coat has been much worn, and has faded to a greenish colour on back and tops of shoulders. As a result of post-mortem examination the medical opinion is that there is evidence of strangulation. The right cheek bone has been broken in, also the chest bone has been driven inwards before death, and could not be self-inflicted. The body is supposed to have been dead about three weeks. Description of body:—Stout build, height about 5ft. 6in., age, colour of hair and eyes and nature of occupation not determinable, tattooed in blue ink on inside of left forearm near elbow joint, two hearts pierced with two arrows with "WR" one side and "RS" other side, middle finger of left hand had a piece of white rag stitched around it near middle joint.
