Description: Medium build, very active, age 27 years, height 5ft. 6in. or 7in., dark hair and small dark moustache, hazel eyes, round visage, sallow complexion, barman or labourer. is a good football player.

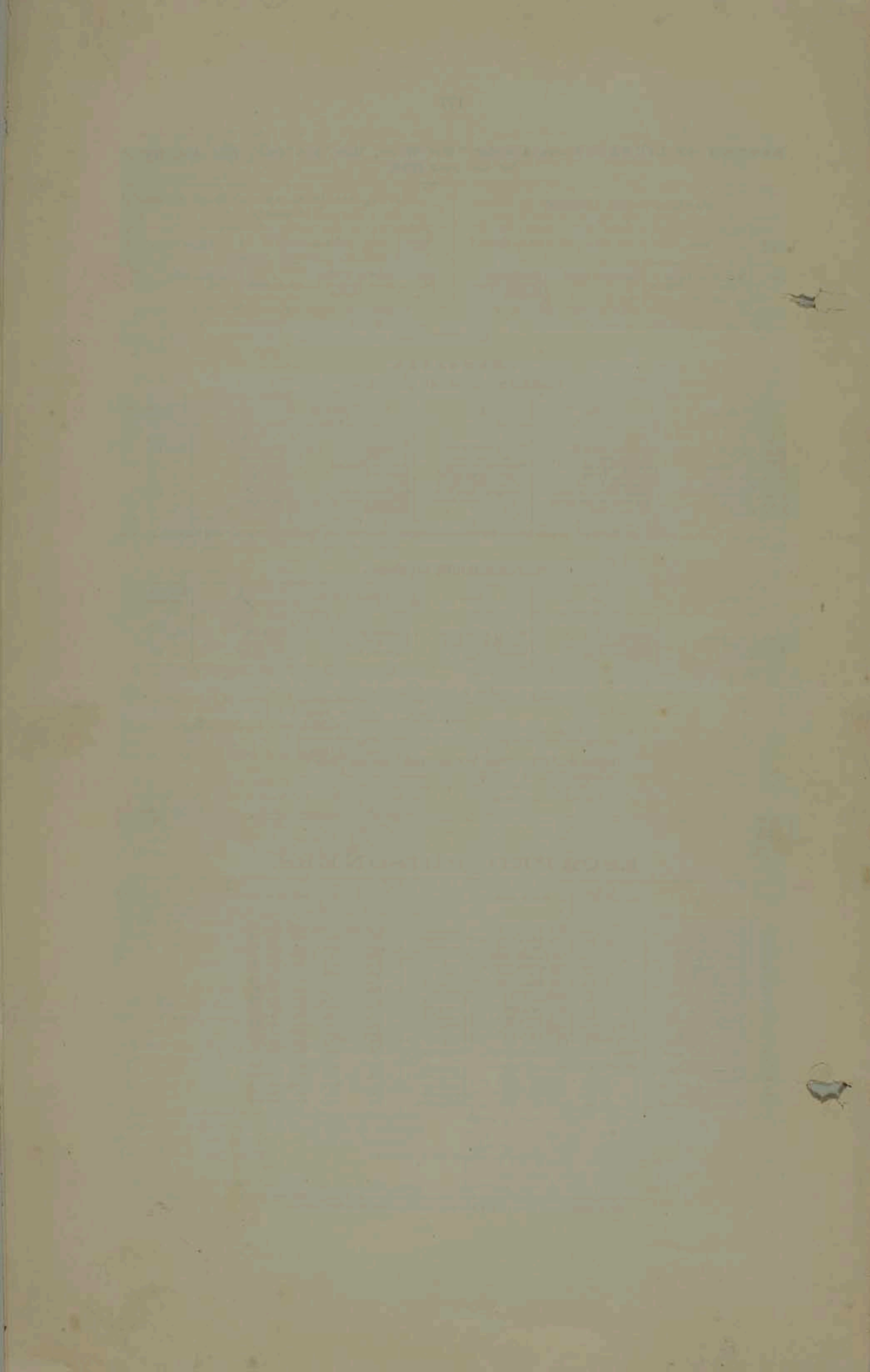
