MURDER.

JOSEPH THOMBLIN *alias* **BENJAMIN OTWAY, FRANCIS VINCENT, TOMPKINS, and UNCLE BEN.**—The apprehension of this man is sought for murder at Peckham, on the 19th August, 1897.
