District Officers will submit as speedily as possible for approval the proposed boundaries of the various sub-districts, with the names of the stations therein.

Maps showing the new district boundaries will be supplied as soon as obtainable from the Survey Department.

POLICE DISTRICTS.

PLANTAGENET.

Bounded on the *South* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony; on the *West* and *North* by the Frankland River upwards from its North to its junction with the Gordon River; thence North-North-Westerly to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarrup Rivers, and onward to the junction of the Murray and Hotham Rivers; thence

Westerly along the Murray River to a point situate South from the South-East corner of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Timber Company's Concession; thence North to a point situate West from the South-West corner of Avon Location 1730; thence East, partly along that location's South boundary; thence Northerly along the Great Southern Railway; thence East along part of the South boundary of Location 1729; thence South-Easterly along a public road from Moorumbine, *via* Yettelin, through the Wickepin Agricultural Area; thence East, partly along the South boundary of C.P. 235, to the Wallemening Brook; thence North-Easterly along said brook to a point situate West from the North-West corner of Williams Location 97; thence East to a point situate 10 miles West from the meridian of the cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence North to a point situate West from a point 90 miles South from survey mark H 26 on Koorarawaltee Granite Rock; thence East to a point situate 52 miles East from the meridian of Mount Ridley; thence North to a point situate East of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence East to the 125th meridian East longitude; thence North to the 30th parallel of South latitude; and thence East to the East boundary of the Colony.

SOUTH-WESTERN.

Bounded on the *West* and *South* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *North* and *East* by lines starting from the sea coast, and extending Easterly through the summit of Mount William, along Logue's Brook and the Murray River to the latter's junction with the Hotham; thence South-South-Easterly to the junction of the Blackwood and Balgarrup Rivers, and onwards to the junction of the Gordon and Frankland Rivers; thence Southerly along the Frankland River to sea coast.

MURCHISON.

Bounded on the *North* by the Tropic of Capricorn; on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony; on the *West* by lines starting from a point in the Tropic of Capricorn in line between Trigonometrical Station Λ_{10} and Mount Bresnahan, and extending South-Easterly to Mount Bresnahan, thence South-Westerly, 37 miles, towards Trigonometrical Station K 20, thence South-South-Easterly to Mount Fraser, thence South-South-Westerly to Mount Lulworth, thence South-Westerly through Warra Warra Hill towards Mugga Mugga Hill; and on the *South* by an East line through a point about 4 miles South from Wyemando Hill to a point situate 15 miles East from the meridian of Mount Ida; thence North about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles, thence East about $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles through survey mark AN (conjoined) 33 at Doyle's Well to a point situate 2 miles 10 chains West from the meridian of survey mark B 82 at Brickey's Soak, thence North to the 26th parallel of South latitude, and thence East to the East boundary of the Colony.

WEST KIMBERLEY.

Bounded on the *South* by the parallel of latitude of $19^{\circ} 30'$ South; on the *West*, *North*, and *East* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent, extending Northerly to Collier Bay; thence by lines extending South-Easterly generally along the summit of the King Leopold Ranges to the Margaret River Gorge; along said river upwards to its junction with the Mary River; and thence South to the South boundary before described.

WESTERN.

Bounded on the *North*, *East*, and *South* by lines starting from the sea coast, and extending East along the Tropic of Capricorn to a point in line between Mts. Palgrave and Agamemnon; thence Northerly to Mt. Palgrave; thence South-Easterly to a point situate 37 miles from Mt. Bresnahan in direction of Trig. Station K 20; thence South-South-Easterly to Mt. Fraser; thence South-South-Westerly to Mt. Lulworth; thence South-Westerly, through Warra Warra Hill, towards Mugga Mugga Hill; thence East to the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield, being a point situate about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles East and 4 miles South from Wyemando Hill; thence South to a point situate East from the North-East corner of Melbourne Location 927; and thence West to said corner, and along that location's North and West boundaries, the North boundary of Location 926, and a West and South line to the North-East corner of Location 938, a West line to the Hill River and said river downwards to its mouth; on the *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

ROEBOURNE.

Bounded on the *South* by the Tropic of Capricorn; on the *East* by the East boundary of the Colony and on the *North* and *West* by the parallel of $19^{\circ} 30'$ South latitude, the sea-coast Westwards to the mouth of the Robe River, and

including the islands adjacent, said river upwards to Yerra Bluff, and by lines extending South-Easterly through the summit of Mt. Dempster to Mt. Riea; thence to Mt. Wall; thence to Trig. Station Λ_{10} and onwards towards Mt. Bresnahan to the Tropic of Capricorn.

ASHBURTON.

Bounded on the *South* and *East* by lines extending East along the Tropic of Capricorn from the sea coast to a point in line between Mounts Palgrave and Agamemnon; thence Northward to Mount Palgrave; thence South-Easterly to a point situate 37 miles from Mount Bresnahan in direction of Trig. Station K 20; thence North-Easterly to Mount Bresnahan; thence North-Westerly to Trig. Station K 10 onwards to Mount Wall; thence to Mount Riea; thence through Mount Dempster to Yerra Bluff on the Robe River, and by said river downwards; on the *North* and *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent.

EAST KIMBERLEY.

Bounded on the *East* by the Eastern boundary of the Colony; on the *North*, *West*, and *South* by the sea coast, extending Westwards to Collier Bay, and including the islands adjacent; thence by lines extending South-Easterly generally along the summit of the King Leopold Ranges to the Margaret River Gorge, along said river upwards to its junction with the Mary River; thence South to latitude $19^{\circ} 30'$ South, and thence East to the Eastern boundary of the Colony aforesaid.

METROPOLITAN.

Bounded on the *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *North*, *East*, and *South* by lines starting from the sea coast at a point situate West from the South-West corner of Swan Location 1351, and extending East towards said corner to a point situate North from the West corner of Swan Location 28; thence South to said corner; thence South-Easterly, partly along the South-West boundary of said Location 28, to a point situate West from the North-West corner of the Canning Jarrah Timber Company's Concession; thence East, partly along said boundary to its East end; thence South along the East boundary of said concession; thence West, partly along the South boundary of said concessions to the East boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 16; thence North along this boundary to that location's North-West corner; thence North-North-Westerly to the South-East corner of Canning Location 25; thence North along that location's East boundary; thence Westerly along the left bank of the Canning River, the Southern shores of Melville Water, and the left bank of the Swan River to a point situate South from Minnim Cove; and finally North and West, crossing the Swan River, and along the East and North boundaries of North Fremantle Townsite, to the sea coast.

SWAN.

Bounded on the *West* by the sea coast, including the islands adjacent; on the *North*, *East*, and *South* by the Hill River upwards to a point situate West from the North-East corner of Melbourne Location 938; thence by lines extending East to said corner; thence North and East to the North-East corner of Location 926; thence North to the North-West corner of Location 927, and East through its North-East corner to a point situate North from the summit of the Woongan Hills; thence South to said summit; thence South-South-Westerly to a point on the Avon River situate North from the North-East corner of Swan Location 1317; thence South, through said corner, to a point situate East from the North-East corner of the Canning Jarrah Timber Company's Concession; thence West, partly along the North boundary of said concession, till it meets a production South-East of the South-West boundary of Swan Location 28; thence North-West along said boundary of Location 28 to its West corner; thence North to a point situate West from the South-West corner of Swan Location 1351; and thence West to the sea coast.

EASTERN.

Bounded by lines starting from the summit of the Woongan Hills, and extending North to a point situate East from the North-East corner of Melbourne Location 927; thence East to a point situate $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles East from the meridian of Wyemando Hill; thence North to a point situate East from Mount Gibson, near Lake Moore; thence East-South-East to a point situate about 50 miles West from survey mark NB 1, near Wangine Soak; thence South, through survey mark H 26 on Koorarawaltee Granite Rock, to a spot situate 90 miles South of it; thence West to a point situate 10 miles West from the meridian of the cairn on Yorkrakine Granite Rock; thence South to a point situate East from the North-East corner of Williams Location 97; thence

West to the Walleleming Brook; thence South-Westerly along said brook to a point situated East from the South-East corner of C.P. 2333; thence West to said corner and North-Easterly along a public road through the Wickopin Agricultural Area, via Yettelin, towards Moorumbine; thence West along part of the South boundary of Location 1729; thence Southerly along the Great Southern Railway; thence West, partly along the South boundary of Location 1730, to a point situate South from the South-East corner of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Timber Company's Concession; thence North, partly along the East boundary of said concession, and also that of the Canning Jarrah Timber Company's Concession, to the latter's North-East corner; thence East to a point situate South from the North-East corner of Swan Location 1317; thence North through said corner to the Avon River; thence North-North-Easterly to the starting point.

FREMANTLE.

Bounded on the West by the sea coast, including Rottneet and the other islands adjacent; on the North, East, and South by lines starting from the North-West corner of North Fremantle Townsite, and extending East and South along that townsite's North and East boundaries, and across the Swan River; thence Easterly along the left bank of the Swan River, the Southern shores of Melville Water, and the left bank of the Canning River, to the East boundary of Canning Location 25; thence South along said boundary, thence South-South-Easterly to the North-East corner of Cockburn Sound Location 16; thence South along that location's East boundary to a point situate West from the North-West corner of the Rockingham-Jarrahdale Timber Company's Concession; thence East through said concession and along that concession's North boundary; thence South, partly along its East boundary, to the Murray River; thence Westerly along said river and up Logue's Brook, and through Mt. William to the sea coast.

COOLGARDIE.

Bounded by lines starting from Survey Mark R 3, and extending South 30 miles 47 chains 56 links; thence 144° 46' for 36 miles 14 chains 81 links to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence Southward and Eastward along that location's East boundary, the West and Southern boundaries of Location 51, and part of the West and the South boundaries of Location 48 to the latter's South-East corner; thence East 35 miles; thence South about 48 miles to a point situate East of a granite rock near the 50-Mile Soak on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence East to a point situate 52 miles East from the meridian of Mount Ridley; thence South to a point situate East from a point 90 miles South from Survey Mark H 26 in Koorarawlyee Granite Rock; thence West to last-mentioned point; thence North through said Survey Mark H 26 to a point situate West about 50 miles from Survey Mark NB 1, near Wangine Soak; thence East to said survey mark, and finally North 87° East 20 miles 22 chains to the starting point.

NORTH COOLGARDIE.

Bounded by lines starting from the Southernmost corner of the Murchison Goldfield, situate about 4½ miles East and 4 miles South from Wyemando Hill, and extending East to a point situate 15 miles East from the meridian of Mt. Ida; thence North about 4½ miles; thence East about 74½ miles through Survey Mark AN (conj.) 33 at Doyle's Well to a point situate 2½ miles West from the meridian of Survey Mark B 82 at Brickey's Soak; thence North to the 26th parallel of South latitude; thence East to the East boundary of the Colony; thence South to the 30th parallel of South latitude; thence West to the 125th meridian of East longitude; thence South to a point situate East from Survey Mark R 3; thence West to said Survey Mark R 3; thence about 267° 1' for 20 miles 22 chains to Survey Mark NB 1, near Wangine Soak; thence West about 50 miles to a point situate North from Survey Mark H 26 on Koorarawlyee Granite Rock; thence West-North-West to a point situate East from Mt. Gibson, near Lake Moore, and also South from the starting point, and thence North to the starting point.

EAST COOLGARDIE.

Bounded by lines starting from Survey Mark R 3, and extending South 30 miles 47 chains 56 links; thence 144° 46' for 36 miles 14 chains 81 links to the North-East corner of Location 53; thence Southward and Eastward along that location's East boundary, the West and Southern boundaries of Location 51 and part of the West and the South boundaries of Location 48, to the latter's South-East corner; thence East 35 miles; thence South about 48 miles to a point situate East from the Granite Rock, near the 50-Mile Soak, on the Dundas and Lake Lefroy Road; thence East to the 125th meridian East longitude; thence North to a point situate East from Survey Mark R 3, and thence East to the starting point.
