There are two classes of schools—
GOVERNMENT SCHOOLS, which are strictly undenominational, are supported entirely by the State. The teaching is secular, but clergymen are allowed to instruct children of their own denomination for half-an-hour during school hours
ASSISTED SCHOOLS are sectarian, and may be conducted by any religious body, subject to the con-

ditions of the Acts. These schools receive State aid to the extent of 35s. per head on the average attendance. The Educational Department has no control over the fees charged or received by Assisted Schools, of which 20 are under the supervision of the Church of Rome and 2 under the Church of England
