The registration of medical practitioners is regulated by the Medical Act 1894 (58 Vic. No. 36), under which the Governor appoints a board of the medical profession to grant certificates of registration to persons possessed of the qualifications.

By the Medical Act the Governor-in-Council may appoint or remove a Medical Board, consisting of not less than three nor more than seven members of the medical profession to whom persons desirous of being registered must submit their degrees, diplomas, certificates or other proofs. The board on due proof of qualification, skill, & ability to practice medicine or surgery, & also that the applicant is a person of good fame & character, must register such in the Medical Register. Every registered practitioner is entitled to receive from the Registrar of the Medical Board a certificate of his registration. The Medical Register of the colony must be annually published in the *Govt. Gazette* in the month of January. No person other than a medical practitioner is allowed to practice medicine or surgery, or to profess to be a medical practitioner, or to pretend that he is qualified to so practice.
