DIRECTIONS.—Slip the Strainer in the Clips of Lever so that the Barrel on which the Wiro Colls is midway between the two clips, as shown in Cut above. Next Press the Groove of the Strainer against the slack Wire, and turn the Lever from Left to Right, as shown by the Arrows, but be carred to keep Lever Parallel with Wire, so as Coll it evenly on the Strainer. Always begin with the Right Hand on Top. Till accustomed to the work take only Half a turn at a time, and place the book on the Wire, which will hold it whilst you change hands without taking the Lever off the Strainer. When tight enough place Wire in Hook and remove the Lever, and the Strainer is left on permanently. Self-holding and cannot be removed without a Lever.
