HENRY CHARLES NEWTON is charged, on warrant issued in Liverpool, England, with stealing £724 from his employer, Joseph Walton, wine and spirit merchant, 4 Hatton Garden, Liverpool, on the 3rd November, 1881. It has been ascertained that the offender arrived in Melbourne on the 16th February last, by the ship Wasdale, from Liverpool. On the 25th of the same month, offender and a fellowpassenger by the Wasdale left Melbourne by the s.s. City of Adelaide, for Sydney; and they returned from there to Melbourne in about a fortnight. Up to this time offender went by the name of Arthur Lilly. On the 6th of April last, a man, who gave his name as Arthur Lilly Hunter, opened an account in the Commercial Bank, Melbourne, by paying in five £100 Bank of England notes, the numbers of which show they were part of the money stolen from Mr. Walton. Before the 12th of the same month this man drew all the money out again, excepting £5, which still remains to his credit. Amongst the money paid out to him were seven £50-notes, a £20-note, a £10-note, and a £5-note, all on the Commercial Bank. Since the 12th of April this man has not been seen by the bank officials. While in Melbourne he bought a gold keyless-watch for £8, a ten-dollar gold coin with a hole in it, a twenty-dollar gold coin, and a double barrelled gun in an oak case. On the morning of the 14th April last he left Melbourne, stating he was going to Ballarat; he took with him a portmanteau, a black leather bag, and the gun and case. He promised to write from Ballarat, but has not done so. He stated he had an uncle, proprietor of a paper in New Zealand, or that he was on the press there. Diligent inquiry is to be made for this offender. If found, the officer in charge of detectives, Melbourne, should be immediately communicated with, who will take steps to have the necessary legal documents obtained for offender's apprehension, as, prior to this being done, interference with or arrest of offender would be improper.

MURDER.

[See Government Gazette, 25th September, 1882, p. 2345.] Murder of Michael Quinlivan at Reedy Creek near Wickliffe.

FIFTY POUNDS REWARD.

Whereas on Monday, the 16th day of August, 1880, the body of a man was found in a paddock at Reedy Creek, seven miles from Wickliffe. And whereas at an inquest a verdict was returned to the effect that the cause of death was from wounds on the head, inflicted by some person or persons unknown. And whereas it has subsequently been proved that the said body was that of a man named Michael Quinlivan, and further inquiries by the police have led to the arrest of Robert Francis Burns, who now stands committed for trial on a charge of murdering the said Michael Quinlivan; and whereas at the time of the murder the said Michael Quinlivan had on him a watch and two rings, hereinafter described, which have not been recovered: Notice is hereby given that a reward of fifty pounds will be paid by the Government for such information as will lead to the recovery of the said watch and rings before the date of the trial of the said Robert Francis Burns on the charge aforesaid.

The clothing found on the body of the murdered man has been identified as that worn by Michael Quinlivan. He had in his possession when murdered the watch and rings hereafter described:—watch, silver open-face, medium size, had bull's-eye glass when last seen, dirty white or cream color dial, name of "M. Quinlivan" engraved on inside of case, which may have been scraped off; a colonial gold ring with white stone; a broad silver ring that had been cut in the middle, reduced in size, and rejoined. The recovery of the watch and rings is of the most extreme importance. Special inquiries must be made of ALL watchmakers, jewellers, or other persons in provincial towns, who might purchase or repair the articles described. Any trace, however faint, of these articles should be immediately communicated to the Superintendent of Police, Hamilton, or the officer in charge of detectives, Melbourne. See Reward above.

HOUSE-BREAKING AND STEALING FROM DWELLING HOUSES.

and three diamonds, gipsy setting; 2 ladies' band rings, one with a small diamond, the other with a ruby; 2 ladies' rings, one ruby and two pearls in each, stamped 18c; a gentleman's ring, a single rose diamond, star setting, underneath place for hair; a ladies' ring, with a diamond and two emeralds in gipsy setting; several ladies' gipsy rings, with three or five stones in each, pearls and imitation rubies and emeralds; a ladies' half-hoop ring, set with five very white pearls; 4 gentlemen's snake-pattern gold rings, one single snake with large rose diamond in head; a ditto with diamond head; a ditto with ruby head; a double snake with a ruby in one head and a diamond in the other. Stolen at the same time, a gold hand-in-hand ring; a lady's gold ring, oblong setting, with small diamonds and rubies in rows; a lady's gold ring, gipsy setting, diamond in centre and emerald each side; a lady's gold ring, set with a row of pearls, a row of sapphires, a turquoise at each side. The gentleman's signet band ring, sardonyx setting, has been found in pawn in Visbord's shop, Elizabeth Street, Melbourne, where it was pledged by a man who called himself Mr. Lessie. He is believed to be identical with ex-convict Henry Lessie (see "Prisoners discharged 25th instant.) Warrants have been issued for the arrest of two men, names unknown, for the above larceny. Description:—1st, English, 25 years of age, 5ft. 4in. high, stout build, dark complexion, and small dark moustache only; wore black paget coat, tweed vest, and black hardfelt hat; 2nd, 23 years of age, 5ft. 3in. high, medium build, dark moustache only, wore dark grey coat, trowsers and hat; has a downcast look. The second offender is believed to be identical with ex-convict Theophilus Rimmington, also discharged from Pentridge last week. The first offender entered complainant's shop under the pretence of buying a ring, and thereby obtained possession of the tray, while the second watched at the door.—O. 5874, September 30th, 1882.
