# Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. <sup>6</sup>/<sub>752</sub>.—His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct that steps are to be taken by the Police throughout the Colony to carry out the provisions of Section 5 of the 49 Victoria, No. 10, "An Act to amend the Dog Act, 1883," viz.: 49 Victoria, No. 10. "It shall be lawful for any aboriginal "native to keep one unregistered dog: provided "always that whenever the number of unregistered "dogs found in the prosession of one or were natives "dogs found in the possession of one or more natives "shall be in excess of the number of the party of such natives, including men, women, and children, such dog or dogs in excess shall be liable to be "destroyed, and all constables are hereby authorised "to destroy the same."

In carrying out these instructions, police constables are to be careful to allow the natives to retain the dogs they desire to select, within the authorised number of course; if the natives will not bring the dogs and choose those they wish to keep, then the police are to carry out the law in the best way they can, but only so that they do not do more than carry it out.

Returns showing the number of dogs destroyed, the names of the natives to whom they belonged, and the circumstances under which the dogs were destroyed, are to be forwarded monthly to the Chief Office.

C.O. 6/753.—His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to approve of the establishment of a Police Force at Cambridge Gulf, in East Kimberley District. The Force to consist of One Sergeant, Six Constables, Four Native Assistants, Twenty horses.

The whole force to be under the charge of the Sergeant.

The Police Force will be under the immediate orders of the Government Resident of the District, whose instructions are to be promptly attended to; but the Sergeant is to forward direct to the Superintendent of Police, by every opportunity, the usual station reports, returns, requisitions, &c., and he is to attend promptly to all orders received from the Superintendent of Police, and to communications from the Detective Office.

The salary of the members of the Force will be as

£36 per annum will be allowed for the support of each Native Assistant.

The duties the Force will be called on to perform will differ, somewhat, from those they may have had to perform in the settled parts of the Colony. Of the nature of these duties Sergeant Truslove has had considerable experience, and in that Officer the Acting Superintendent of Police is prepared to place every confidence.

The Acting Superintendent of Police desires to impress on the Constables the necessity on their part of according a ready and cheerful obedience to all orders they may receive, of showing on all occasions civility to all persons with whom they may come in contact, and a readiness to assist them. Of exercising forbearance and patience, coupled with firmness, when dealing with the aborigines, and of discharging their duties generally with intelligence and assiduity, as well as to the satisfaction of the Government Resident and the Settlers in the District, and thus bring credit on themselves and the Police Force of which they are members.

# Circular Orders and Miscellaneous Information.

C.O. 6/756.—Certain cases of sudden death having recently occurred to native prisoners whilst travelling under Police escort, His Excellency the Governor, with a view to prevent such occurrences, has been pleased to direct the issue of the following instructions for the information and guidance of the Police throughout the Colony, whenever they may be engaged in escorting native prisoners, viz.:—

- 1. Native prisoners en route are to be halted as frequently as circumstances will allow.
- 2. Native prisoners are to be given water as often as they want it en route, and it can be had.
- 3. The Police are to carry as much water as the means at their disposal will allow, for the use of the native prisoners.
- 4. Native prisoners are to be allowed to rest, when practicable, during the heat of the day.
- 5. Whenever a native prisoner shows signs of fatigue, arising from want of water, or excessive heat, or exhibits symptoms of sunstroke, an immediate halt is to be made, and every available means of relief must be afforded to the sufferer.
