In the event of new stations being established in any of the police districts named, members of the force attached to same will be entitled to draw ration allowance according to the rates fixed for stations where local conditions are similar.

As the railway is extended in the North Coolgardie District, the rate of ration allowance at stations brought into proximity with the line will be reduced to £25.

Subsistence Allowance.
