C.O. $\frac{82}{1808}$, and $\frac{28}{1802}$, relating to the despatch of the periodical returns in wrappers, open at both sides, by parcel post, must be strictly obeyed under the new system, and District Officers are instructed to see that the greatest economy is observed in the use of stamps for postal matter and telegrams.
