| Adams, Mary (nee Martin) | | | Arrived on "Rockingham". Husband William Adams. |
| Adams, Julia Ellen | 1842 | 1928 | Pioneered Nungarin. 1911-1926. Born 1842. Died 1928. |
| Adams, Margaret Jane | | | Narembeen Shire. Went to South Kumminin in 1911 as one of the first settlers in that district. |
| Adams, Margaret Young | 1883 | | Born 1883. Arrived Manjimup 1923 |
| Adams, Sophia Maria Douglas Walker | | | Serviced the first Post Office Harvey District, 1883-1893. |
| Adamson, Mary (nee Lukin) | | | 1 st woman to reside on Drumdyer Farm, Beverley, 1897. 1 st President Central Division CWA, 2 nd President Beverley Branch. |
| Adlam, Catherine (nee Brownrigg) | | | Wife of Joseph Adams. Pioneer of Trayning. Settled there 1910. |

| Allbeury, Grace Catherine (nee Armstrong) | | | Wife of Chaucer Goding Allbeury. Pioneer of Merredin district. Before marriage helped her parents with 1 st boarding house in Merredin. |
| Allen, Bridget (nee Wynne) | | 1920 | Arrived on "Palestine" 1867. 86 years old at time of death. Lived in Fremantle all her married life. |
| Allen, Emily Jane | | | Pioneer of Bruce Rock district. |
| Allen, Kathleen | | April 1966 | Settled at East Pingelly 1912. Pioneered virgin land. Died aged 82 years. |
| Allen, Marjorie Justina Seagrim | 15 April 1894 | 15 March 1966 | Wife of Frederick Henry Harman Allen. Born at Woodside, South Australia. Died at Dandenong, Victoria. Came to WA 1910, to Kendenup 1921. Had 7 sons and 2 daughters. |
| Allen, Nancy Lorne (Miss) | | | Perth. 1 st woman to pass the examination of the Architects Board of W.A. in 1932 and 1 st woman to become an Associate of the Royal Institute of Architects of W.A. |

| Anderson, Harriet (nee Martin) | 1842 | 1923 | Born, married and buried at Upper Swan. Born 1842, died 1923, aged 81. |
| Anderson, Isabella (nee Cooke) | March 1876 | 1958 | Born Toodyay March 1876. Died Cunderdin August 1958, aged 82. Pioneer of Cunderdin. |
| Anderson, Sister Jane E | | | Pioneer Bush nurse for Walpole district. Came from Ireland to Group 116 in answer to ad for nurses and deaconesses. Period 1929 – 35. |
| Anderson, Margaret Hannah Hamish | | | Went to Dowerin as a bride in 1904. Reared family of 5 children. |
| Anderson, Marie | | | Cunderdin district pioneer. |

| Annert, Sophia (nee Smith) | | | Arrived Goldfields c.1890. Travelled to Northam by train, then camel to Kanowna. Her 2 nd husband died in Kanowna when she was 46 and she moved to Kalgoorlie. |
| Annice, Annie | | | Wife of James Annice, Kojonup. Brief biographical details. |
| Appleyard, Mary (nee Warner) | | | Wife of Thomas. Came to Kununoppin 1911. |
| Arber, Prudence | | | Went to Mt Barker at early age. |
| Archer, Fanny Grace (nee Snook) | | | Married 24 April 1891. Arrived in Wandagee May 1891. Pioneer of district. |
| Archer, Lily Mabel (nee Tanner) | | | Arrived from England 1910 and settled on virgin land at Manjimup. |
| Argus, Mary Honore | | | Albany. Born in Scotland, came to W.A. 1927. Married 1931. Went to Goldfields with husband 1934. Foundation Secretary of CWA, Mt Many Peaks and 1 st mover to get school bus to that district. |
| Argyle, Amy Augusta | | | Goldfields journalist 1907. Known as “Carrie” of the “Miner”. Started weekly feature ladies letter. |
| Armstrong, Agnes (nee McHard) | 1861 | | (Mrs Lindsay Armstrong). Married 1880. Lived in Greenbushes district, property named “Southampton”. |

| Ashe, Bessie | | 1962 | 1 st marriage Lorden (pioneer of Katanning) 1914. 2 nd marriage Ashe (Pioneer of Kojonup) 1926. |
| Ashman, Eliza (nee Coates) | | 1894 | Born at Coates Siding 1861. Married Mr H.J. Ashman. Pioneered land at Baker’s Hill. |

| Augustin, Babette (nee Waldheir) | | November, 1966 | Biographical information on Buntine resident, Dalwallinu district. |
| Auld, Lily May | | May 1937 | Arrived in Muntadgin district 1919. Died in Merredin May 1937. |
| Austin, Dorothy Gwendoline (nee Lavis) | 1904 | | Arrived Katanning 1913 – 1960. Eldest of family of 11. Taught at country schools Glen Lynn, Coomelberrup, Wilgoyne, Glencoe, Westwood and Corackine. Helped develop farm east of Katanning. Family of 3 girls and 1 boy. |

| Balding, Maida Florence | 1874 | 30 November 1945 | Nursed at Coolgardie during typhoid outbreak. Matron Fremantle Hospital 1914-1939. Born London, died Perth. |
| Baldwin, Mary (nee Carroll) | | | Left England with soldier father who passed away during voyage. Arrived on "Belgravia" 1865. Married Joseph Pickering, St John's Church, Fremantle. Reared a large family and after husband's death married Denis Baldwin. |

| Bancroft, Jane (nee Couper) | 1882 | 24 July 1968 | Born Victoria. Arrived Dowerin 1898 with parents. Married Arthur Bancroft 1904. |
| Bandy, Elizabeth (nee Williams) | | | With husband Joseph pioneered farm at Hutt, formerly known as Yuba No. 2. District opened 1910. Pioneer of Northampton from 1890, moved to Hutt to obtain bigger acreage for sons. |
| Banks, Annie (nee Ledger) | 1862 | | Born Leeds, England 1862. Wife of Frederick William Banks. Left England March 1882 on the "Fitzroy", arrived Fremantle June 1882. Settled in Hay Street West, later moved to Stirling Street. |
| Banks, Mrs H. J. | | | Vice-President of Women's Auxiliary Churches of Christ, WA. |
| Barclay, Lydia Louisa (nee Stabb) | 1875 | | Wife of Edgar James Barclay, married in Coolgardie April 1898. Born 1875 in Victoria. 1901 moved to Kalgoorlie. |
| Barnacle, Sophia Lucy Caroline | | | Went to Mt Barker from England as the wife of the first married Rector of All Saints Church of England about 1910. |

| Batty, Ada | | | Wife of Alfred. Married at York 31 August 1904. Spent first half of her life on farming properties before moving to township to live. Had 6 children. (York Shire) |

| Bauer, Mary Jane (nee Groch) | 1858 | 1942 | Wife of Louis. Born Holland 1858, married about 1875 in N.S.W. Settled in Northam 1892. Attended sick and maternity cares and a devoted worker for charity. Awarded certificate from Red Cross for devoted service to cause 1914-18 wars. Died Northam 1942 aged 84 years. |
