Cain, Charlothe Sarah (nee Gardiner)		28 October 1944	Wife of Henry Cain, married 7 March 1888. Born at her parents farm "Mountain Springs" in Ferguson district. Married in original church. Rode their horses to their home "Brookview", Brookhampton (Dardanup). Reared 12 children - 10 sons and 2 daughters.
Cairns, Jane Henderson			Narembeen. Came to East Hill 1912, pioneer of district.
Calder, Margaret			Gnowangerup. Wife of John, pioneer of Needilup 1914.
Caldow, Matilda			Gnowangerup. Wife of John. Opened first Café.
Caldwell, Keezie (nee Corney)			Came with husband from South Australia. In February 1910 went to a farm as pioneers of Badgebup, east Katanning. Her early days were under pioneer conditions.
Cambell, Elizabeth (nee McGregor)	1879	1955	Brief biographical notes of Kellerberrin pioneer.

Cammilleri, Kate Bayliss (nee Layman)	1867	1946	Born Wonnerup House. Married 1895 F.W.P. Cammilleri. Died Busselton. Before her marriage, managed Wonnerup Dairy.
Campbell, Alice			Pioneer of Trayning where she settled 1909.
Campbell, Alice (nee Adams)			Early pioneer of Koorda district 1910.
Campbell, Charlotte Amelia			Perenjori district. Came as bride to Bowgada district 1916 and was one of 1 st women to live in district. Suffered usual hardships of pioneer and reared 7 children – was reputed to be wonderful cook and homemaker at present living and 80 years of age (1965/6.
Campbell, Elizabeth (nee Osborne)			Wife of David. Came to Kununoppin 1910.
Campbell, Emma Amelia (nee Smith)	1864	25 May 1948	Very Brief biographical notes on Northam resident.
Campbell, Iris Mary (nee Hope)			Born Dongara 1885 went to Onslow, taking over Hope’s Hotel.
Campbell, Margaret Joan			One of 1 st settlers on virgin land at Merredin. Early dates not known. Foundation member Senior Citizen’s club of Merredin.
Campbell, Miss Marion	1867	1960	Went with parents to Murchison in 1880, then to Gascoyne, overland, in 1883. After mother’s death in 1885, brought up younger members of family.
Campbell, Mrs Peter			First woman to hold a driver’s licence in Ace-Day Dawn-

Carroll, Annie Jane			Tammin district. Went farming 1910 on virgin lane. During her life helped with delivery of children and cases of sickness.
Carroll, Catherine			Brief biographical notes.
Carroll, Ellen (nee Cronin)			Born Northam, arrived Carnarvon 1882. Married Michael Carroll, first wheelwright, partner of J. Morrell, first blacksmith, later property owner and teamster Gascoyne district.
Carroll, Kathleen			Arrived in Narembreen district 1920 to farm on virgin land 1 mile east of Billaring Siding.
Carroll, Rose			Mt Magnet Shire.
Carruthers, Mrs Agnes		1923	Pioneered virgin land in Lake Grace 1911. Died Lake Grace 1923.

Carter, Leah		13 September 1946	With husband Reuben and son Bert, arrived on their farm, Three Springs, 17 March 1906. Mrs Carter 1 st woman to go on land in this area. 81 years of aged when she died.
Carter, Louisa (nee Rice)			Pioneered farm 4 miles out of north Tammin, 1910.
Carter, Rebecca (nee Gentle)	15 April 1875	29 September 1958	Brief biographical notes on Merredin pioneer.
Carter, Ruby Blanche			Pioneer of Cunderdin district.
Carwardine, Annie Jane		1951	Wagin. Arrived Moulyinning 1910 to pioneer farm, after husband’s death worked farm with help of 2 sons. Left there 1930s. Lived in Perth until war years. Returned to Kukerin where she remained until her death in 1951, aged 82 years. Member of Kukerin CWA.

Chapman, Agnes (nee Duffield)			Born Fremantle. Went to Roebourne, married E.W. Chapman in the Old Court House, Roebourne – lived on Mardie Station. Life-long friend of Mrs Withnell.
Chapman, Alice Jane	1857	1934	Wife of Charles. Ravensthorpe district 1901.
Chapman, Amelia (nee Glindon)	1818	27 April 1886	Arrived in W.A. 1840. Married Henry Chapman December 1840. Had no children. Was noted for hospitality and well-run property. Died at her home. Husband erected 1 st flour mill on their property where it still stands today.
Chapman, Mrs Clara Louise			Donnybrook Shire. Pioneered virgin country at Lowden 1925-6, lived in bark hut, no roads or bridges, only had draft horses and dray. Taught children by correspondence. Member of Noggerup CWA.

Chick, Mrs Eva Wesley (nee Waldeck)		7 April 1959	Wife of Percy Edwin Chick. Northampton district 1910. Carted 1 st load of wheat in a cart, taking 6 days to Northampton in 1911, brought back stores in exchange.
Chidlow, Christine Ellen (nee Campbell)	24 October 1857	9 March 1934	Wife of William John Chidlow. Mother of 10 children, lived in Northam district all her life.
Chidlow, Mary (nee Woodward)	1818	12 July 1866	Arrived W.A. on “Hooghly” 12 February 1830. Born England. Wife of William Chidlow, who with John Morrell, were pioneers of Northam, arriving there July 1832.
Chilcott, Lucy Mabel (nee Gardiner)	1876		Born Fremantle 1876.
Chipper, Marjorie Ellen (nee Thomas)			Corrigin Shire. Very brief biographical notes.
Chipper, Mary	1811	1878	Arrived Albany on barque “Caroline” 1829 aged 18 years with husband. Mother of 6 sons and 1 daughter, all born in Australia.
Chipper, Sarah Maria (nee Stirling)	14 November 1841	9 April 1926	York Shire. Married 21 June 1868.
Chitty, Hannah (nee Lynch)	1838		Wife of Charles Henry. Very brief biographical note on Toodyay and Goomalling resident.
Chitty, Martha (nee Herbert)	29 April 1850	24 November 1934	Came to Toodyay and spent her life there. Daughter of Charlotte and John Herbert, pioneers of that town. Wife of Henry Thomas Chitty.
Chown, Mrs Adelaide			Pioneer of Flowery Patch, Cunderdin.
Christie Phoebe	1859	1953	Born Rockingham. Lived Rockingham approximately 30 years, then pioneered at Jarrahdale, later Fremantle and Perth.

Christison, Mary Josephine			Arrived W.A. 1897. Had business in Coolgardie, later moved to Leonora, where she married in 1901.
Christmas, Hannah (nee Martin)			Born at Middle Swan, married in York aged 16, had 16 children. Northam resident.
Chugg, Miss A.I. (Queenie)			Foundation member W.A. Branch Penguin Club 1945, pioneered establishment of W.A. branch. Member of Soroptomists Club, Tree Society, National Trust and many others.
Church, Emily Alice (nee Wrightson)	30 March 1912		Arrived Albany “Marathon” 12 June 1920. Attended East Denmark School 1922-6. Married 1937, still lives on farm pioneered by Church family.
Church, Ethel (nee Donnell)			Wife of Mr T. Church. 1 st Principal Kindergarten Teacher’s College of W.A. 1913.
Church, Hannah			Denmark. Settled on virgin land with young family in primitive conditions, with one horse transport 1921.
Clancy, Mary Ann (nee Molong)	1878	1966	Born South Australia. Wife of James Joseph Clancy, pioneer of “Clear Valley Farm” Gnowangerup 1905.
Clapham, Elizabeth			Member of Cottesloe Council and 1 st member of a Council in W.A. Also Inspector of Factories and strong supporter of Labour Party.
Clark, Caroline			Came to W.A. 1869 with her husband. Early pioneers of virgin country in Great Southern district (Narrogin Shire).
Clark, Mrs Effemia			Pioneer of Tammin where they took up virgin land 1910. Previously in Northam, opened up 1 st Salvation Army Post.

Clark, Elizabeth May			Merredin Shire. With husband and 3 young children arrived Korbel 1911. Educated her children as no school available until 1921. 1917 elected leader of Social Committee until her retirement. With her sister supplied music for social gatherings.
Clark, Emily			Pioneer of South Kulin September 1912.
Clark, Janet (nee Ambrose)			Wife of John Clark. Dandaragan Shire.
Clark, Julia			Bruce-Rock Shire. Pioneer of Ardath district 1913-1963.
Clarke, Ann Maria (nee Waldock)	1 June 1857	12 December 1939	Youngest daughter of Mr and Mrs Waldock “Glenavon” via Northam. Died at Goomalling. Married James Clarke, St John’s Northam, by Rev. Brown. They pioneered farm at Jurocken via Northam.
Clarke, Annie			Arrived in Kalgoorlie-Coolgardie from Victoria with 3 children, March 1897, to join her husband. After suffering hard conditions, her health suffered and that of her 18 months old child. They came to reside in Perth.
Clarke, Annie Kirkham	1877	1965	Born Adelaide. Died Perth. Nursing pioneer of Royal Perth Hospital. Received 1 st certificate 1899.
Clarke, Elizabeth Brinkley (nee Smith)	1856	1951	Born Perth, where Central Arcade stood. Wife of Captain Frederick Edward Clarke.
Clarke, Euphemia (nee Gillies)			Brief biographical details of Salvation Army Officer.
Clarke, Grace Johnston			Travelled by coach to make home on virgin land, Coolgardie 1892-1908. Later to Perth 1908, where she worked hard for community. Her husband walked from Albany to Coolgardie and Goldfields.
Clarke, Lillian Grace			Pioneered a farm at Hillman, West Arthur district 1907.
Clarke, Louisa Frances			Wife of Ephraim Mayo Clarke. Married 8 July 1876. Reared 12 children. Mr Clarke was Mayor of Bunbury 3 times and MLC for 20 years. Worked hard for all

Clarkson, Isabella Julia (nee Lukin)	1849	1934	Born and died Toodyay. Married Barnard Clarkson (son of Michael) 1867 and went to manage "Oakabella" Champion Bay. Returned to Mt Anderson, Toodyay, 1873.
Clarkson, Jane (nee Drummond)	1813	1905	Married Michael Clarkson 1833. Arrived W.A. with parents on Parmelia 1829. Went to Wilberforce, York, and later to Toodyay where she lived for the rest of her life, mostly at Mt Anderson.
Clarkson, Sarah Ann		1927	Very brief biographical notes on Dongara resident.
Clatworthy, Emily Elizabeth (nee Ralph)			Wife of Joseph Clatworthy, Smith's Mill now Glen Forrest. From 1888 until 1913 worked as midwife for Hills district any hour of day or night. (Mundaring Shire).
Clausen, Alice (nee Sheppard)			Wife of Fred. Pioneer of Kununoppin – arrived 1910/11.
Clay, Mary Catherine			2 nd wife of Rev. Charles Clay, 1890 at Wilberforce. (Mother of Mary Emily Dempster - nee Marsden) she lived with Dempsters at Esperance during her widowhood.
Clegg, Ellen			Went to Pingrup district on virgin land 1911 with her husband and 2 schoolboy sons. Lived in tents for some time.
Clements, Anna (nee McBean)	1868	1953	Kalgoorlie. Biographical information on schoolteacher.
Clements, Florence Minetta	1884	1965	Fremantle. Wife of Walter H. Akehurst, 1 st marriage

Clifton, Christina (nee Martin)			At 19 years became engaged in 1840 to Robert William Clifton. Left England on Parkfield in December for Leschenault Inlet, arriving March 1841. Had 11 children and suffered many hardships and floods and lack of supplies.
Clifton, Elizabeth (nee Ferguson)			Wife of Worsley. Landed Bunbury, then Australind approximately 1840.
Clifton, Florence Mabel			Accompanied husband and 2 children to settle on virgin land at Northampton 1910. Home for a long time was a tent. Retired from Northampton approximately 1950.
Clifton, Kate			Foundation member and co-foundress Anglican Mother’s Union at St Johns, Fremantle 1898. Life vice-president and Hon. Correspondent of Invalid Prayer Circle of the Mothers' Union for many years.
Clifton, Mrs Marshall Waller (nee Bell)	1792	1866	Married 1811. Widowed 1861. Came from England. 1840, with husband. Had 15 children, 11 of whom came to W.A. Had 60 Grandchildren and 173 Great Grandchildren. Staunch Quakeress.
Clifton, Sarah Eleanor (nee Broadhurst)	18 July 1865		1 st white girl born in North West. Pioneer of Harding River near Roebourne.
Climie, Bessie	12 April 1887		Arrived Cranbrook district 1913.
Climie, Eliza		16 July 1920	Arrived from Scotland 1882. Lived at Ballochmyle, Cranbrook. Died aged 74 years.
