

BULLER-MURPHY, Dr Deborah.

Deborah Buller-Murphy (1887-1965), was born on 18 June 1887 at West Guildford, Western Australia, daughter of Frederick Slade Drake-Brockman, surveyor, and his wife Grace Vernon, née Bussell. She married Sir John Winthrop Hackett in 1905. After his death she married Sir Frank Beaumont Moulden in 1918, then Basil Buller Murphy in 1936.

Deborah was a mining industry leader and investor, welfare worker and Girl Guides leader.
