Mrs Ilona Hrubos was born on 1 February 1928 in the town of Mahr, Schonberg in the Sudetenland, a German part of Czechoslovakia. As a result of World War 11 she became a displaced person. Ilona Hrubos, her husband and child arrived in Fremantle aboard the Anna Salem 2 on 1 January 1951. They went first to the Northam migrant camp and from April 1951 lived in Glen Forrest where she still lives.
