#### BUNBURY, H.W. (HENRY WILLIAM), 1812-1875

A soldier and explorer, Henry Bunbury arrived in Western Australia in March1836 as Lieutenant of the 21<sup>st</sup> Regiment. He was stationed at York, Pinjarra and Busselton and discovered the Bunbury district on a pioneer overland journey from Perth to the Vasse River settlement (later Busselton). He led a punitive expedition against Aborigines in the Avon Valley after the murder there of white settlers. Lt. Bunbury left Western Australia in 1837.

The papers were donated to Battye Library by Mr. G.E. Clarke in March 1946 (Acc.327A); by Mr. Charles Bunbury in August 2007 (Acc.6895A); and by Phyllis Barnes in March 2009 (Acc. 7146A).
