

## SIERAKOWSKI, CHARLES (KAZIMIERZ) (1924-2009)

Charlies Sierakowski was born in Poland in 1924, and joined the Polish resistance at 16 following the German invasion of Poland. He became a prisoner of war in Austria following the defeat of the Polish uprising in 1944. Following his liberation he moved to Italy where he studied architecture, and then London, where he graduated as an architect. He worked on rebuilding London, including a wing of the British Museum, as well as helping with the designs of the Crystal Palace National Sports Centre, the Royal Festival Hall, the South Bank cultural development on the Thames and the National and Tate Galleries. For five years he lived in Ghana, where he designed many structures, including police and customs buildings and a prison. In 1965 he returned to Britain, where he designed a new council suite and offices, library, drama theatre and arts college for the Borough of Sutton. He arrived in Perth in 1973, where he worked for the Public Works Department. In this role, he helped design the Perth Cultural Centre, the Aberdeen Street TAFE building and the WA Art Gallery. He also served as an adviser to the Geraldton Art Gallery and the Bunbury Arts Centre (now the Stirling Arts Centre), as well as other groups.
