May Lorna O'Brien (nee Miller) was born in 1938 to a Wongi mother and white father. She was educated at Mt Margaret Mission and Perth Girls School. She became a teacher and was first appointed to the Mt Margaret Mission School. May was awarded the British Empire Medal in 1977 for services to education. She has written many children's books and served on many committees on Aboriginal issues. May was heavily involved in the campaign to provide all Aborigines with birth certificates.
